All entry forms must be completed and signed. All horses/ponies showing in WPCSA classes must have a legible copy of the Welsh Certificate of Registration on file with the secretary.

The judge's decision is final.

All Welsh ponies six years & over, showing in breeding classes and all Welsh and ½ Welsh showing in performance classes MUST BE MEASURED or present a valid WPCSA or USEF measurement card. Measuring will be done between 8 and 8:30 AM.

The judge, rules committee or show grounds manager may intercede in any situation that appears unsafe to exhibitors, animals or bystanders to reduce the possibility of accident or injury. Any acts of discourtesy or disobedience to the judge or officials, or the part of the owner, rider or groom shall disqualify the ponies and the owner shall forfeit his/her entry fee and other fees.

Removing the bridle from an animal harnessed to a vehicle or leaving an animal unattended while hitched, anywhere on the show grounds, will result in instant elimination and removal from the show grounds.

Junior exhibitors must wear approved protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) at all times whenever mounted or in a driven vehicle at all times while on the show ground. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place.

WPCSA Class Descriptions

Breed Classes – Article 110.2

Animals are to be shown in hand at a walk and trot except in group classes. Purebred Welsh to be judged 85% on breed type, conformation, way of going, quality and substance and 15% on disposition and manners. Natural reaching action is desired. Half-Welsh to be judged 85% on conformation, way of going, quality and substance and 15% on Welsh breed type, disposition and manners.

Performance Classes

WPCSA Welsh English Pleasure – Article 112.3

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring on light contact without martingale. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working class to be judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA Welsh Western – Article 112.4

To be shown at a walk, jog and lope both ways of the ring without martingale on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. To be judged 65% on performance with an emphasis on manners, 25% on breed type, movement and conformation, 10% on appointments. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA Welsh Hunter -Article 112.5

Over fences(o/f): To be shown over a course of a minimum of six fences with eight jumping efforts of the required height. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes judged 100% on performance. Animals not exceeding 13.2 hands will jump 2'0", animals exceeding 13.2 but not over 14.2 hands shall jump 2'6". Animals exceeding 14.2 hands jump 2'9". Under saddle (u/s): To be eligible, pony must have shown in and completed an over fences class. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. **May be required to gallop one way of the ring, but no more than eight animals at one time.**

WPCSA Pleasure Driving -Article 113.1

To be shown to a suitable two or four-wheeled vehicle or four-wheeled vehicle for pairs, but not a viceroys, racing sulky or fine harness rig. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, working trot and trot on and stand quietly and except for tandems, **to back readily**. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA Carriage Driving - Article 113.2

Wire wheeled vehicles permitted. In addition to the gaits detailed in the pleasure driving section Article 113.1 (walk, working trot, trot-on, halt and rein-back), carriage driving also requires the slow trot which is slower and more collected but not to the degree required in the dressage collected trot. The animal should indicate a willingness to be driven on the bit while maintaining a steady cadence. Turnout to be judged 70% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, neatness and appropriateness of attire and overall impression; 30% on performance, manners and way of going. Working class to be judged 70% on performance, manners and way of going; 20% on condition and fit of harness and vehicle; 10% on neatness of attire. Obstacle/ Cones to be Judged 100% on performance. Open to ponies/cobs and half-welsh.

WPCSA Carriage Driving Working

A carriage driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the suitability of the animal to provide a pleasant drive.

To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot and trot on. To stand quietly, both on the rail and while lined up, and to rein back. All entries chosen for a workout may be worked both ways of the arena at any gait requested by the judge and may be requested to execute a figure of eight. To be judged 70% on performance, manners and way of going; 20% on condition and fit of harness and vehicle; 10% on neatness of attire.

WPCSA Obstacle - Pick Your Route

1. To be driven over a course of obstacles (paired markers) with no set route. The number of obstacles to be proportionate to the dimensions of the driving area. Not to exceed 20 obstacles.

2. Typically obstacles in this type of class are not measured for each entry, but are set at 2.5 meters or 8'3" at the start of the competition, and only reset in the event of a knockdown.

3. After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle to the designated finish line, choosing his own route. Each obstacle is to be negotiated once and only once, but may be approached from either direction.

4. Course faults are scored as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time.

Placings are determined on a low total time basis. Ties for first will be decided by a drive-off.

5. Penalties (as they differ from those under penalties section):

- a) Knocking down or dislodging obstacle 5 seconds
- b) Driving through an obstacle again 10 seconds each time
- c) Missing an obstacle Elimination

WPCSA Obstacle - Time Competition. Not to exceed 20 obstacles (pairs of cones topped with tennis balls). Faults add seconds to total time. Fastest time wins.

1. To be driven over a prescribed course of obstacles. The number of obstacles to be proportionate to the dimensions of the driving area. Not to exceed 20 obstacles.

2. After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle in order to the designated finish line.

3. Course faults are scored as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time.

Placings are determined on a low total time basis. Ties for first will be decided by a drive-off

OPEN DIVISION

OPEN HALTER – open to all horses and ponies, mares, geldings & stallions.

OPEN MOUNTAIN & MOORELAND - Open to all Dartmoors, Connemara, Shetland, New Forest, Dale, Fell, Highland and Welsh Ponies, fillies, mares, geldings, colts and stallions, all ages

OPEN LEAD LINE – Open to leadline riders 7 yrs old and younger. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or junior 14 years or older. No chain leadlines.

OPEN WALK – TROT – Open to all beginner riders. To be ridden both ways of the ring at a walk and trot. To be judged on performance and riders ability to control mount. Rider is not eligible to ride in any canter class

OPEN WALK – TROT GROUND POLES - Open to all beginner riders. To be ridden over a course of 4 ground poles, entirely at the walk or at the trot. To be judged 100% on performance. Rider not eligible for any canter class.

OPEN WALK – TROT CROSSRAILS - Open to all beginner riders. To be ridden over a course of 8 crossrails, maximum of 18". To be ridden entirely at the walk or entirely at the trot. To be judged 100% on performance. Riders are not eligible for any canter class.

OPEN HUNTER - To be shown over a course of 8 fences. Height to be determined by rider – 2' to 2'6". To be judged 100% on performance.
